The Store offers grave markers with the VFW emblem as well as grave markers that specify service in Vietnam, Afghanistan and Iraq, plus a grave marker for any U.S. veteran. To see these, go to vfwstore.org/category/memorial/graveitems.

U.S. flags designed to fit these grave markers are also available in two sizes. For those, click <u>vfwstore.org/products/GP110</u>. The flags are made in the USA.

Store your keepsakes in a hand-carved wooden box with branch of service coin. The set includes a blank card with envelope and seal, plus a boxed handkerchief, made in the USA. Shop for the box at wdfwstore.org/products/32405. Or purchase the boxed handkerchief separately at wdfwstore.org/products/32406.

If you need a casket flag, go to <u>vfwstore.org/products/22290</u> for a heavyweight cotton flag made in the USA.

And to display your casket flag, check out the various styles of flag cases, from simple boxes to ones with branch of service emblems, or the VFW emblem, and a flag case with an additional memorabilia case. Click wfwstore.org/category/memorial/flagcases for more.
