

VFW National Convention Returns to Kansas City

JCS Chairman General Dunford to receive top VFW award Monday; President Trump headlines Tuesday

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — President Donald Trump will be joining more than 10,000 members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and its Auxiliary as they bring the 119th VFW National Convention to the Kansas City Convention Center this Saturday through July 25. The business sessions are closed to the public, but a free, two-day weekend veterans walk-in claims clinic and four-day health fair are accessible to all veterans, service members and their families.

"Kansas City is home to the VFW's national headquarters, but it's been 11 years since our last national convention was held here, so it is great to be back!" exclaimed VFW National Commander Keith Harman. "We are also honored to be able to present our highest award to Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Gen. Joe Dunford on Monday, and to have President Trump join us on Tuesday," he said. "The president's attendance continues a longstanding VFW tradition to provide our nation's commander-in-chief with the opportunity to address the nation's largest and oldest major war veterans' organization, which is especially important during a time of war and instability abroad and internal challenges at home."

Harman said the 10,000 VFW and VFW Auxiliary delegates will represent the organization's total membership of 1.7 million at the weeklong convention. Their mission will be to approve new national priorities to guide the VFW as it lobbies Congress on issues important to the nation's veterans, service members and their families. In addition, convention delegates will elect a new VFW national commander, Vincent "B.J." Lawrence of Alamogordo, N.M., as well as recognize prominent individuals and organizations for their support of the veterans and military communities. A number of elected officials from Missouri and Kansas will be appearing at the weeklong convention, as well as many VFW partners from the nonprofit community and the Departments of Defense, Labor and Veterans Affairs. Also attending will be retired Marine Corps Lt. Col. Oliver North, a VFW life member and former national award recipient who was recently selected to become the

new president of the National Rifle Association.
